Do You Want to Change Your Name? (Adult)

What is this for?	This packet contains the forms you need to file for a Civil Name change. See page 2 for information about different types of name change orders.
Step 1: Fill out the forms	Civil Case Cover Sheet (CM-010) Petition for Change of Name (NC-100) Attachment to Petition (NC-110) Order to Show Cause for Change of Name (NC-120) Decree Changing Name (NC-130) CLETS Background Information Supplement (Local form PL-CV003)
Step 2: Make copies	Take each form and make 2 copies. Paperclip and two-hole punch the <u>original</u> at the top. Do not staple the original. The copies may be stapled. Put the copies right behind each original.
Step 2: File the forms Filing fee	Get a number ticket for "Civil" at the kiosk on the 1st floor of the courthouse. File the forms with the clerk when your number is called. The clerk will file-stamp the first 4 forms and give you back the 2 copies. You will keep a filed copy for your records and give the 2 nd copy to the legal newspaper that will publish your name change request. There is a \$435.00 fee to file the case with the court. The court accepts cash, check, Visa, MasterCard, AMEX and Discover Card. If you cannot afford to pay the filing fee, you may apply for a fee waiver by filling out and filing these forms: Request to Waive Court Fees (FW-001) Order on Court Fee Waiver (FW-003)
Step 3: Publish the Order to Show Cause	Contact a court-approved legal newspaper to arrange for it to publish your Order to Show Cause for Change of Name (NC-120) once a week for four weeks in a row. It must be published 4 times before your court hearing date. There is a cost to publish that you pay directly to the newspaper. The court fee waiver doesn't cover those costs. Check the Local Form Publication List for Placer County for a list of approved newspapers. Once the Order to Show Cause has been published for the required period of time, the newspaper will file a Proof of Publication with the court.



Next steps:	<p>Go to your court hearing: Attend the court hearing. If all of your paperwork is in order and there are no objections filed, the Judge is likely to grant your request.</p> <p>(optional) Certified copies: If you would like a certified copy of your Decree Changing Name, take a number ticket for “Civil” at the ticket kiosk on the 1st floor. Some agencies require a certified copy of the name change. The certified copy can be used to obtain a new birth certificate, new social security card and new driver’s license. There is a fee for certified copies.</p>
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Important Things to Know

There are different ways your name can be changed. If you were divorced, for example, and want to change your name back to a name you had before you were married you can do that in the divorce case. If you have questions, visit the Self-Help Center.

If you also want to change your gender or want your address to be confidential for safety reasons please visit the court’s Self-Help Center for help.

Where can I get the forms?
