### CURRENT STATUS

Reduced operations to critical minimum functions. See details outlined in the Court's 4/8/20 notice.

**Thru 5/8/20**

### PHASE 1A

Judicial holiday ends, default judgment processing resumes. Mandatory eDelivery begins for represented parties and attorneys.

**5/11/20**

### PHASE 2

Civil trial conferences resume, mandatory remote appearance. Settlement conferences return, use of video technology required.

**5/22/20**

**\*Date is contingent on status of and restrictions related to Public Health or Governor's Stay at Home Orders.**

### PHASE 4

Civil jury trials resume.

**\*Date is contingent on status of and restrictions related to Public Health or Governor's Stay at Home Orders and dependent on Criminal Trial Backlog.**

### PHASE 1B

Ex parte and law and motion type hearings return, mandatory telephone appearance. Except for restraining orders, mental health, and firearms, where video appearance will be available, subject to request process.

**5/11/20**

### PHASE 3

Civil court trials resume (jury trials unlikely due to expected backlog of criminal trials). Small Claims hearings resume, remote strongly encouraged. Historic Courthouse reopens with potential restrictions that follow public health guidelines.

**\*June**

**\*Date is contingent on status of and restrictions related to Public Health or Governor's Stay at Home Orders.**

### PHASE 5 & BEYOND

Unlawful detainer summons, trials, and writs resume. Potential return of in-person settlement conferences. Potential removal of mandatory remote appearances.
