PRIOR STATUS

Reduced operations to critical minimum functions. See details outlined in the Court's 4/8/20 notice.

Thru 5/8/20

CURRENT STATUS

Judicial Holiday ends; default judgment processing resumes.
Mandatory eDelivery begins for represented parties and attorneys.

Eff. 5/11/20

CURRENT STATUS

Request for order hearings, including DCSS and contempts, resume. Mandatory telephone appearance for all hearings, except for restraining orders. Video appearance may be available for restraining orders.

Eff. 5/11/20

CURRENT STATUS

Trial confirming conferences resume, mandatory telephone appearance except for restraining orders. Mandatory settlement conferences resume.
Optional settlement conference program added for trials impacted March to May.

Eff. 5/22/20

CURRENT STATUS

Family Law trials resume. Remote options may be available.
Historic Courthouse reopens, with restrictions that follow public health guidelines.

Eff. 6/1/20

PHASE 3A

* Return of 18 Month FCCR, potentially remote only.

8/31/20

* Date is contingent on status of and restrictions related to Public Health or Governor's Stay at Home Orders.

PHASE 3B

Return of in-person 6 and 12 month FCCR.

9/28/20

* Date is contingent on status of and restrictions related to Public Health or Governor's Stay at Home Orders.

PHASE 4 & BEYOND

Consideration begins for:
Return of in-person mediation.
Removal of mandatory remote appearances.
