STANDING ORDER RE COVID-19
PANDEMIC: EXTENSION OF
EMERGENCY ORDERS RE
ALL CRIMINAL MATTERS

In light of the national COVID-19 pandemic and in conjunction with the March 30, 2020 Order of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California along with the General Order #2 re: Implementation of Emergency Relief issued by the Superior Court of Placer County on April 10, 2020, the court makes the following orders, effective immediately:

- **CONTINUANCE OF FELONY HEARINGS [Defendant NOT in Custody; No Preliminary Hearing; Time Waivers]:** The court will continue all hearings in felony cases set between April 13, 2020, and May 8, 2020, in which (1) defendant is not in custody; (2) a preliminary hearing has not been held; **and** (3) defendant has waived their right to have a preliminary hearing held within 10 court

1 days and/or 60 calendar days pursuant to Penal Code section 859b,
2 to an available date four weeks from the currently scheduled court
3 date.

4 • **CONTINUANCE OF FELONY HEARINGS [Defendant NOT in
5 Custody; Preliminary Hearing Held/Waived; Time Waivers]:**

6 The court will continue all hearings in felony cases set between April
7 13, 2020, and May 8, 2020, in which (1) defendant is not in custody;
8 (2) a preliminary hearing has been held or waived; **and** (3)
9 defendant has waived their right to be brought to trial within 60
10 days pursuant to Penal Code section 1382, to an available date four
11 weeks from the currently scheduled court date.

12 • **CONTINUANCE OF FELONY HEARINGS [Defendant NOT in
13 Custody; Defendant on Probation/Parole/Post Release
14 Community Supervision/Mandatory Supervision]:**

15 The court will continue all hearings in felony cases set between April 13, 2020,
16 and May 8, 2020, in which (1) defendant is not in custody; (2)
17 defendant is on probation, parole, post-release community
18 supervision, or mandatory supervision; **and** (3) defendant is on
19 calendar for any motion, program review, or other review, to an
20 available date four weeks from the currently scheduled court date.

21 • **CONTINUANCE OF MISDEMEANOR HEARINGS [Non-
22 Arraignment; Defendant NOT in Custody; Includes DUIs]:**

23 The court will continue all non-arraignment hearings in misdemeanor
24 cases, **including driving under the influence cases**, set between
25 April 13, 2020, and May 8, 2020, in which defendant is not in
26 custody, to an available date at least eight weeks from the currently
27 scheduled court date.

1 • **CONTINUANCE OF TRAFFIC/NON-TRAFFIC INFRACTION AND**
2 **TRAFFIC MISDEMEANOR HEARINGS [Excludes DUIs]:** The
3 court will continue all non-traffic infraction, traffic infraction, and
4 traffic misdemeanor hearings and trials, **not including driving**
5 **under the influence cases**, set between April 13, 2020, and May
6 8, 2020, to an available date at least eight weeks from the currently
7 scheduled court date.

8 • For all of the foregoing cases, it is hereby ordered that:

9 (1) Defendants shall appear at the continued hearing date;

10 (2) Defendants shall continue to comply with any applicable
11 criminal protective order;

12 (3) Defendants shall continue to comply with all own recognizance
13 terms, release terms, bail terms, supervised release terms,
14 supervised release own recognizance terms, and home
15 monitoring terms and probation terms during any
16 postponement period. Under any forms of release, if
17 defendant is required to report to the probation department
18 as part of their release order or probation terms, the
19 defendant is ordered to continue to report to the probation
20 department.

21 **This order DOES NOT APPLY to the following cases:**

22 **(1) Mental health treatment court;**

23 **(2) Cases where the defendant is charged with a crime**
24 **alleging a sex offense;**

25 **(3) Sexually violent predator (SVP) cases;**

26 **(4) Search and arrest warrants;**


27 **(5) Petitions related to bail;**

28 **(6) Juvenile justice and juvenile dependency cases**

1 **Scheduled felony and misdemeanor non-traffic arraignments**
2 **and all preliminary hearings shall remain set, regardless of the**
3 **defendant's custody status.**
