TEMPORARY STANDING ORDER RE
FORTY FIVE (45) DAY EXTENSION
OF TIME FOR MISDEMEANOR
DEFENDANT TURN IN DATES ON
APRIL 7, 2020 THROUGH APRIL 30,
2020

In light of (1) declarations of a state of emergency by federal, state, and local governments due to the COVID-19 / novel coronavirus global pandemic; (2) Executive Orders by the Governor of the State of California; (3) orders and directives of the Chief Justice of the State of California; (4) the need for the Placer County Sheriff to maintain a jail inmate population in a responsible, reasonable, and safe manner to comply with government public health directives; and (5) discussions with the offices of the Placer County Sheriff, District Attorney, Public defenders and Probation Department, the court issues the following temporary standing order:

Subject to the exceptions listed below, the jail commitment date of any Defendant convicted of a misdemeanor offense who was ordered by the Placer Superior Court to report to either of the Placer County Jail facilities

1 (located in Auburn and Roseville California) to commence or complete his/her
2 jail sentence, between the dates of April 7, 2020 and April 30, 2020, is
3 postponed for an additional 45 days from the date of their present report to
4 jail date.

5 Further, all Defendants whose jail report date have been postponed by
6 this order are hereby ordered to report back to the Placer County Jail at 7:30
7 pm on the particular date 45 days from their present report to jail date.

8 Further, all Defendants whose jail report date have been postponed as
9 a result of this order are ordered to comply with any and all conditions which
10 may have been imposed at the time of their sentencing.


11 This temporary standing order is applicable only to defendants in
12 misdemeanor cases.

13 This temporary standing order shall not apply to misdemeanant
14 defendants whose jail report date was for the following offenses:

- 15 • Domestic violence;
- 16 • Elder abuse;
- 17 • Sexual abuse or charges related to sexual abuse;
- 18 • Charges involving violence or violent conduct; or
- 19 • Driving under the influence.
