STANDING ORDER RE COVID-19
PANDEMIC: EXTENSION OF
EMERGENCY ORDERS FOR FAMILY
CENTERED CASE RESOLUTION
CONFERENCES

The World Health Organization, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the State of California, and Placer County have recognized that we currently face a life-threatening pandemic caused by the COVID-19 virus. As of this date, there is no known cure, vaccination, or consistently effective treatment. In response to the spread of COVID-19, states of emergency have been declared nationally and in most States.

Placer County health officials followed state and federal guidance by issuing recommendations and mandates intended to decrease the spread of the virus. This Placer County Superior Court previously issued temporary emergency orders with respect **family law matters and specifically family centered case resolution conferences** in response to the

1 declarations of a state of emergency, Executive Orders by the Governor of
2 the State of California, and orders and directives from the Chief Justice of
3 the State of California.

4 The number of COVID-19 cases in Placer County has increased
5 substantially since that time. The County has surpassed 100 cases per
6 100,000 residents, has a positive testing rate of over 8%, and as of July 28,
7 2020 had fewer than five hospital beds and intensive care unit beds
8 available. These factors are outside the State of California benchmarks for
9 community transmission and Placer County remains on the State of
10 California's COVID-19 County Monitoring List. Counties on this list must
11 follow more restrictive guidelines for services as outlined in California
12 Department of Public Health's July 13, 2020 Guidance on Closure of Sectors
13 in Response to COVID-19.

14 In order to proactively support the efforts of State and local public
15 health officials, while balancing the need for continuous operation of the
16 court; and in light of (1) declarations of a state of emergency by federal,
17 state, and local governments due to the COVID-19 / novel coronavirus global
18 pandemic; (2) Executive Orders by the Governor of the State of California;
19 (3) orders and directives of the Chief Justice of the State of California; and
20 under the authority of Code of Civil Procedure section 128 and California
21 Rules of Court, rule 10.603, the court issues the following temporary
22 standing order:

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
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- 1 • **CONTINUANCE OF FAMILY CENTERED CASE RESOLUTION**
2 **CONFERENCES:** The court will continue all 18-month Family
3 Centered Case Resolution Conferences currently set between
4 August 1 and August 28, 2020 to an available date eight weeks from
5 the currently scheduled court date. Matters will be heard in
6 Department 32 at 1:30 pm.
