

STANDING ORDER RE COVID-19
PANDEMIC: EXTENSION OF
EMERGENCY ORDERS FOR FAMILY
CENTERED CASE RESOLUTION
CONFERENCES

The World Health Organization, the United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the State of California, and Placer County have recognized that we currently face a life-threatening pandemic caused by the COVID-19 virus. As of this date, there is no known cure, vaccination, or consistently effective treatment. In response to the spread of COVID-19, states of emergency have been declared nationally and in most States.

Placer County health officials followed state and federal guidance by issuing recommendations and mandates intended to decrease the spread of the virus. This Placer County Superior Court previously issued temporary emergency orders with respect **family law matters and specifically family centered case resolution conferences** in response to the

1 declarations of a state of emergency, Executive Orders by the Governor of
2 the State of California, and orders and directives from the Chief Justice of
3 the State of California.


4 Placer County remains on the State of California's COVID-19 County
5 Monitoring List due to a disease 14-day average case rate of more than 100
6 cases per 100,000 people. Counties on this list must follow more restrictive
7 guidelines for services as outlined in California Department of Public Health's
8 July 13, 2020 Guidance on Closure of Sectors in Response to COVID-19. The
9 County will remain on the County Monitoring List until the 14 day average
10 case rate drops below 100 people per 100,000 residents for three
11 consecutive days.

12 In order to proactively support the efforts of State and local public
13 health officials, while balancing the need for continuous operation of the
14 court; and in light of (1) declarations of a state of emergency by federal,
15 state, and local governments due to the COVID-19 / novel coronavirus global
16 pandemic; (2) Executive Orders by the Governor of the State of California;
17 (3) orders and directives of the Chief Justice of the State of California; and
18 under the authority of Code of Civil Procedure section 128 and California
19 Rules of Court, rule 10.603, the court issues the following temporary
20 standing order:

- 21 • **SIX AND TWELVE MONTH FAMILY CENTERED CASE**
22 **RESOLUTION CONFERENCES:** The court will drop all 6-month
23 and 12-month Family Centered Case Resolution Conferences
24 currently set between August 31 and September 25, 2020.
