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**THE PLACER SUPERIOR COURT ANNOUNCES CHANGES TO  
REMOTE APPEARANCES IN CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS**

The Placer Superior Court announces implementation of Standing Order 22-04 effective July 1, 2022, modifying procedures related to remote appearances in felony and misdemeanor proceedings. Standing Order 22-04 is adopted in response to the June 30, 2022 sunset of Placer County Superior Court Local Emergency Rule 10.28 and California Rules of Court, Emergency Rules, rules 3 and 5. The court recognizes that there are continuing discussions in the Legislative and Executive branches related to remote appearances in criminal proceedings and will update this standing order as necessary due to any new laws. This standing order shall remain in effect until repealed or replaced by Local Rule.

Eligibility for remote appearances is defined by hearing type. For most criminal matters, attorneys who are appearing on behalf of their client pursuant to P.C. 977 may self-schedule their remote appearance on the court's public website no later than 4 pm the court day before the hearing (<http://www.placer.courts.ca.gov/RAS.shtml>). Attorneys who are not appearing on behalf of their client, and defendants requesting to appear for applicable hearing types, are still required to file the request form, which can be found on the Local Forms webpage: <http://www.placer.courts.ca.gov/forms-filing-forms.shtml>.
